Dear Nursery families,

Happy New Year and welcome back! We are excited to be starting a new term in Nursery. We are also excited to welcome new children to the class, they have all had a fantastic start this week!

My planning, preparation and assessment time is on Tuesday afternoons, Jo will be covering Nursery during this time too.

In Nursery we follow the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum, providing activities for children to access themselves and we take a child-led approach to their learning. We encourage children to explore and learn at their own pace, driven by their natural interest and curiosity. Adults in the setting observe children as they play, identifying areas of interest and development. From there, we plan engaging activities that build on these interests, helping to extend their learning in fun and meaningful ways. By allowing children to take the lead, we foster independence, confidence, and a lifelong love of learning.

Here is a general daily timetable for Nursery

8.45am arrival and settling

8.55am carpet time

9.10am free flow activities (including snack time at 10am)

11.20am carpet time, sharing our learning

11.30am eating lunch in the dining hall

11.45am morning children go home

12 Afternoon children arrive, free flow activities

1pm carpet time

1.15pm free flow activities (including snack time 2pm)

2.40pm tidy up time

2.55pm carpet time, story time

3.15pm home time

Within free flow time we carry out focus tasks related to our termly theme and also focus stories. We carry out activities 1:1 and in small groups.

Each term we have topic or theme to guide us in our learning along with the children's interests. This term the topic is 'Bears'. We will read a range of stories featuring bears, focusing on a different story each week. This will provide us with activities across the curriculum to explore with the children. Please see the attached topic square of how the topic is taught this term. The objectives progress each term throughout the year to ensure development of key skills and objectives.

Please continue to send your child with a spare set of clothes to stay on their peg. We encourage children to use the toilets and will work with families to support with getting used to toilet training if needed. Please also send children with a labelled water bottle. Children have access to drinking water as well, but we find it works well if they have their own bottle to keep hydrated.

Please notify the school and provide a photograph if a different person is collecting your child.

Children are welcome to take a book from our class library for you to read together at home. We will change these books every Tuesday and Thursday but can be changed any time in between too.

Outdoor play is an essential part of our daily routine, giving children the opportunity to explore nature, develop physical skills and enjoy fresh air.

We will continue to take observations on software called Evidence Me, used to document your child's learning and progress across the year. We will also share some of these with families, there is no set frequency for the observations as it is dependent on activities and interactions observed. Please check your emails over the coming days for an email from Evidence Me with information of how to sign up.
