PE

- Know that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults
- Find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans for survival
- Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating a sensible diet and hygiene

Music

- Learning to sing songs and play music created by Inspirational People of Colour

Computing

- Use different software programs that enhance mathematics learning

English

- Respond to a story by discussing aspects of it and relating these to own experiences
- Predict what might happen in a story
- Compose and rehearse sentences orally before writing
- Write in complete sentences
- Use imagination to create character profiles and descriptions
- Write sentences containing extended noun phrases
- Begin to write a story based on a careful plan
- Explore a non-fiction text giving information and create factual sentences.
- Check punctuation, spelling and sense making of finished writing
- Read aloud what they have written to others

Skills and Knowledge

Maths

- Place value in 2-digit numbers
- Comparing, ordering, reading and writing (numbers and words) numbers 0-50
- Adding and subtracting using 2-digit numbers
- Understand that addition can be done in any order but subtraction cannot; understand that multiplication can be done in any order but division cannot
- Counting in 2's, 5's and 10's forwards and backwards using 0-100
- 2, 5 and 10 times tables
- Division as grouping
- Solving missing number problems
- Odd and even numbers

RE/PSHCE

- Know that there are different ways to celebrate the birth of babies in different families
- Know that in many Christian churches babies are welcomed during a special service.
- Know that stories that Jesus told were a way of telling people about God
- Know what happens in a Christening service, the roles of the participants and that this is a ceremony for welcoming the baby into the Christian family
- Know that some of the clothes, actions, and artefacts are symbolic and what the symbolism is

Geography/History

- Use maps, atlases and globes to trace the journey of HMS Empire Windrush
- Compare and name the physical and human geographical features of the Caribbean and the UK
- Describe significant historical events of local area – Windrush
- Discuss the lives of significant people of colour and their national and international achievements

Art/DT

- Make sensible choices about what to do next – create 'swimming' pictures after reading the poem 'Swimmer' by Faustin Charles
- Close observational drawings of Caribbean fruit
- Experiment with tones using pencils and design vibrant textiles
- Know about artistic works from different cultures – Dancing Lady by Bernard Hoyes
- Use a variety of techniques to create portraits of famous people of colour
- Portraits of famous black heroes
