## YEAR 5 NEWSLETTER - Autumn 1

## **Dear Parents and Carers.**

Welcome back – we hope you all had a wonderful Summer break and that you are excited for your child to be in Year 5. We are very much looking forward to having a positive and creative year. Ms Manning will be teaching Monday to Wednesday and Ms Curran Wednesday to Friday, so on the crossover day, Wednesday, we teach in class either AM or PM on rotation. We are very lucky to have Kristina in class with us, who knows the children very well after spending last year supporting them.

Year 5 is full of exciting topics and opportunities and this term our **topic** will be based around **The Tudors**. Our **science** topic is **Forces**, in which we will be studying the effects of friction and gravity through lots of investigations. In **Maths** we will be focusing on place value. There are **weekly spellings** to learn based on the Year 5 spelling rules for example adding suffixes, prefixes, homophones and silent letters. These will go home on a **Friday and the test will be Friday the following week**. There is also a statutory list of words that the children are expected to be able to spell by the end of year 6 (see attached). We will include these in writing and topics but please encourage your child to learn them by having them up around the house.

We ask that you hear your child **read aloud every day for 15 minutes** or so and that you continue to read to your child every day for as long as you like. Afterwards, please encourage them to complete an activity in their reading journal, we will look at these whenever the children want to share their work and on their guided reading day.

For maths, please keep going over their times tables and number facts as frequently as you like – it really helps to keep them fresh in their minds so that they can easily access them when needed both in life and maths lessons/tests. Games like Hit the Button are perfect for helping your child to recall their number facts so please do encourage them to play for ten minutes every day to increase both their speed and automaticity: <a href="https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button">https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games/hit-the-button</a>
