Dear Parents and Carers.

We hope you all had a good half term and are looking forward to another fun packed term. We will continue to develop our knowledge of the Tudors but will shift our focus on to Elizabeth I, Shakespeare, buildings of the period and exploration.

Please find the creative homework ideas attached. A lot of hard work went into last term's projects and the children really enjoyed sharing them with the class, they are proudly displayed in the classroom.

We ask that you hear your child read aloud every day for 15 minutes or so and that you continue to read to your child too. Please encourage your child to use their reading journal at home to record writings and drawings about characters, plot and settings of the books they are reading.
