## YEAR 6 NEWSLETTER - AUTUMN 2 2024

## **Dear Parents and Carers.**

Welcome back! I hope you all managed to have a relaxing break. This half-term promises to be a busy one; as well as revising learning from Year 5 we will ramping up work on reasoning, problem solving and comprehension with the Tests-That-Must-Not-Be-Named on the horizon.

This half term our **topic** is World **War 2**. We will be looking at how the local area was affected during the worst days of WW2. Our **science** topic is **Electricity**. We will be constructing circuits and investigating how different components work with a series circuit. In Maths we will be looking at long division before going on to look at fractions, ratio and proportion. We will also be using these skills practically by cooking some wartime recipes!

Year 6 children will be set a **homework project** related to their topic every half term. Please find attached some ideas on the other side of this sheet. There will also be **weekly spellings** to learn. Spellings will go home on a **Monday** and be tested on a Friday. Use Look, cover, write and check to help your children learn these!

We will be sitting the SATs exams in May. We will be preparing for these throughout the year, looking at mathematical reasoning, spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPaG) and reading comprehension. Please make sure your child reads regularly and to make record on their reading journal of what they have read. Ask your child questions to check their understanding about what they have read and to see if they can make predictions about the story. We will be practising these skills during guided reading every day but practise at home is invaluable.

**PE** is on **Thursdays**- please ensure your child has a fully **labelled** PE kit and brings it to school on these days as this is an invaluable lesson.
